

COOKIES

Cookies (so-called "cookies") are computer data, especially text files that are stored in the terminal equipment of the Service User and are designed for use with Web Service. Cookies typically contain the name of the website from which the storage time on the final equipment and a unique number.

CBB uses cookie files to collect information related to your use of the Services by Users and does not collect any automated other information about the User. This action is not collecting or processing personal data. You can disable cookies by configuring your web browser settings used by User, however you might lose access to some of our features.

The services of CBB cookies are used to:

- adapt web content to the Service User preferences and optimizing the use of the websites, in particular, these files allow the user to identify the device and properly display the Service website, tailored to their individual needs;
- to create statistics that help to understand how users navigate through the service, to use the Service Members of the websites, which can improve the structure and content;
- the maintenance of the Service User sessions (after logging in), so the user does not have on every page of the Service re-enter login and password;

Can I opt out of accepting cookies?

Activities related to storing and sending cookies are supported by web browsers and are invisible to the user. Most used browsers accept cookies by default. However, you can set your browser to reject requests to store cookies at all or some cookies. This can be done using the settings in your browser. Before you decide to change the default settings, remember that a lot of Cookies help increase convenience of use. Disabling Cookies may have an impact on how we will view the page in your browser.

How do I disable cookies?

For Firefox:

1. At the top of the browser window, press Firefox, (in Windows XP, click the Tools menu) and select Options.
2. Choose Privacy.
3. From the drop-down menu item Firefox select: will use custom settings for history.
4. Select Accept cookies to enable, uncheck to disable cookies.
5. Select how long cookies should be stored.
6. Press OK to close the Options window.

For Google Chrome:

1. Click Chrome on the browser toolbar. Select Settings.
2. Click the Show Advanced Settings.
3. In the Privacy section, click Content settings.
4. In the Cookies section, you can change the following settings for cookies.

Default block cookies

- Block all cookies: select the Block setting any data from websites. Note that this setting prevents the action of most pages that require a login.
- Block only third-party cookies: select Ignore exceptions and block the creation of third-party cookies.
- If you select this check box to reject the site from third-party cookies, even if the site has been added to the list of exceptions and can create cookies on your computer.

Default allow cookies

- If you want to allow both your own cookies and other companies cookies, select Allow local data.
- To accept only your own cookies, select Block, without exception, all third-party cookies.

For Internet Explorer 9:

1. In the browser window, click Tools, and then click Internet Options.

2. Click the Privacy tab, and then under Settings, move the slider to the highest position to block all cookies, or to the lowest position to allow all cookies, and then click OK.

CBB informs, that at the time of connection to the Site by you, the system logs information appears with the number (including IP) and the type of end-user devices, as well as the time of connection to the Service, and other operating data on user activity on the Site. CBB for technical processes this information in accordance with the rules in force on the territory of the Polish law.
